Nuclear energy: The only viable option for our future, says scientist Joy P Varghese

Coimbatore: With the available resources and the constraints we face today nuclear energy is the only viable option for the future, said Joy P Varghese, scientist and site director of the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Project of NPCIL, here on Friday.

The Times of India, in collaboration with the Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL), organised the NIE-Educator's Knowledge Meet-2024 at The Residency Towers, Coimbatore. Over 102 participants, including 41 principals and 61 teachers from 58 schools, gathered to discuss the topic "Nuclear Energy: Clean, Green, and Sa-

fe."

Joy P Varghese highlighted the current energy mix in India, stating that thermal energy from coal and fossil fuels plays a major role.

"Nuclear energy currently constitutes only about 2.5% of our energy mix, which is not significant," he noted. "However, considering the future, our options are limited.



Hydro plants have reached their saturation point, and we can't expand much further."

He emphasised that while thermal energy is currently the primary source, its sustainability is uncertain. "What alternatives do we have? Wind and solar energy exist, but they have their limitations; for instance, the efficiency of a wind turbine is only about 22%," Varghese explained. "Thus, with the available resources and constraints, nuclear energy stands out as the most viable option for the future."


Umed Yadav, additional

chief engineer in the Directorate of Corporate Planning & Corporate Communication at NPCIL, Mumbai, spoke in detail about common misconceptions surrounding nuclear energy and its safety aspects. Following his presentation, there was a Q&A session where principals and teachers raised various questions, which Yadav addressed.







HOW I OVERCAME STAGE FRIGHT BECAUSE OF SBOA

How does stage fright feel like to you? For me, my heart would race, and any bit of confidence I had would vanish before I even reached the stage. Standing in front of the crowd, my knees felt like they might buckle at any second and I gripped the microphone so tightly. My hands ached. The words I spoke came out shaky and filled with fear. And after each speech, I always walked away feeling like I had not done well at all. This happened to me during the early stages when I used to experience stage fright a lot. Other factors include lack of preparation, no enough time, the expectation of perfection on your very first try, inexperience, and constantly comparing yourself to others. One great advantage of SBOA is that the teachers are always ready to review your performance and offer that encouraging pat on the back, helping you approach the stage with confidence.

However, I did not enjoy my first speech at all. The anxiety and constant feeling of 'I am not good enough' overwhelmed me. But, with some experience and participation in competitions, I gradually discovered just how much I enjoyed it. If it had not been for the teachers of SBOA encouraging me to participate in elocutions—especially when I did not believe in myself—I do not think I would have ever discovered my passion for public speaking. I would have stayed forever in the audience instead of standing on the stage.

Along this journey, I have learned several key strategies to overcome stage fright. First, always focus on the purpose of your speech instead of doubting yourself. Body language plays a huge role, so stand tall, keep your volume strong, and if you are feeling nervous, try moving around the stage to calm yourself. If you are feeling a bit more confident, make eye contact with the audience and maintain a steady tone throughout your speech. Practice is essential—especially in front of a mirror if you can. One of the things I love about SBOA is that we celebrate many special occasions, which always provide opportunities to practise and improve our skills. Students are consistently encouraged to participate in activities that bring out their best. Breathing exercises can also help to steady your nerves. Before stepping onto the stage, remember that it is just an experience, and it will help you

grow regardless of how you perform. It is perfectly normal to feel nervous, but how you manage that nervousness is what truly matters.

Having overcome stage fright, I am now confident in my abilities. I focus solely on doing my best, and as a result, my skills have greatly improved. Overcoming stage fright was not easy but the support of my school, parents, and teachers was invaluable in this journey.

It was because of SBOA and its wonderful teachers that I was able to pursue and improve my passion for public speaking. I am truly grateful to SBOA for consistently providing me with countless opportunities and serving as a wonderful platform to express my talents. So, the next time you are asked to perform on stage, remember to take a deep breath and let yourself flow. It may not be perfect—nothing ever is—but as long as you are doing your best that is what truly matters. Because it is not the fear that we must conquer, but the courage to face it.

Where did the missing dollar go?

Answer:

The friends paid \$ 30.

The bill paid was \$ 25, so the waiter returned \$ 5.

The waiter kept \$ 1 back to the friends (\$ 1 each)

The Key Point:

Each friend effectively paid \$ 9 (\$27 total).Out of this \$ 27:

\$ 25 went to the restaurant.

\$ 2 went to the waiter.

The "missing dollar "is an illusion caused by adding \$ 2 (tip) to \$ 27 (total paid), which does not make sense.

Instead, the correct breakdown is:

\$ 27 paid = \$ 25 (bill) + \$ 2 (tip). There is no missing dollar! The puzzle relies on a misleading way of framing the math.

Golden life!


